



FRUIT OF THE LAND "PINATA"

MATERIALS

Brown paper bag
Tissue paper, bright colors
String or yarn
Hole punch
Scissors
Glue





DIRECTIONS

Cut tissue into strips 3"-4" wide. Cut strips into a fringe, leaving 1" uncut along the top edge.

Starting at the bottom of the bag, glue the strips around the bottom of the bag. Layer the strips so that the fringe on top covers the glued area of the layer beneath. Layer until the bag is covered.


Cut several long streamers of different colors and glue to the bottom of the bag, so they will hang and flutter.

Cut fruit shapes (apples, oranges, bananas, lemons, grapes, etc.) from tissue. Glue to the ends of some of the fringe.


With the hole punch, make holes around the top of the bag 2" apart. Thread the yarn or string through the holes.

Fill bag with small boxes of raisins, fruit-shaped candy, small bags of nuts, maybe even some small toys. Pull the string securely and knot.

Tie pinata in a tree or high place where it could be hit with sticks (plastic bat works well). Blindfold each person as they take turns trying to break open pinata.
