BAPTISM

Scripture reading: Mark 16:16; Matt. 28:19; Rom. 6:3-4; 1 Cor. 12:13; Col. 2:12; 1 Pet. 3:20-21; 1 Cor. 10:1-2; Acts 2:37-38,41; 8:12,37-38

I. The importance of baptism:

- A. Believing and being baptized is the complete step of salvation Mark 16:16:
 - Believing saves us from eternal condemnation, and we receive the Savior not only for forgiveness of sins but also for regeneration – Mark 16:16b.
 - 2. Baptism is a testimony, an affirmation of our believing, which saves us from the world Mark 16:16a; 1 Pet. 3:21 and note 21³,
- B. Baptism saves us from the world:
 - 1. The world is condemned in the eyes of God -John 12:31,
 - 2. The world lies in the evil one 1 John 5:19.
 - 3. The world crucified the Lord Jesus Acts 2:23; cf John 15:18.
 - 4. The world is at enmity with God James 4:4.
- C. Baptism puts us into:
 - 1. The Triune God Matt. 28:19 and notes $19^{3,4}$.
 - 2. Christ—Rom. 6:3.
 - 3. The death of Christ Rom. 6:3-4.
 - 4. The Body of Christ -1 Cor. 12:13.
- D. Baptism is as necessary as repenting and believing Acts 2:37-38, 41.

II. The meaning of baptism:

- A. Being put into Christ Rom. 6:3 and note 3^1 .
- B. Being identified with Christ's death and resurrection -Rom. 6:3-4 and note 3³; Col. 2:12.
- C. Being a testimony 1 Pet. 3:21.

III. The types of baptism:

- A. Noah's ark-1Pet. 3:20-21.
- B. The Children of Israel's crossing of the Red Sea-1 Cor. 10:1-2.

- IV. The examples of baptism all being by immersion Matt. 3:16; Acts 8:38-39.
- V. The partakers of baptism (who should be baptized) anyone who believes - Mark 16:16; Acts 8:12, 8:37-39; 18:8.
- VI. The time for baptism as soon as one believes Acts 2:41; 8:12, 37-38; 16:33; 22:16.
